

Georgia Coalition Against Domestic Violence 2012 General Assembly - Legislative Report January 23, 2012

- The 2012 General Assembly convened on January 9. This is the second year of a two year session which means that any bill that did not pass last session is still eligible to be passed. Any bills that do not pass this session will be dead and must be reintroduced next session.
- **Budget Shelter Funding FY 2012** Amended & FY 2013: Good news! Governor Deal has recommended that shelter funding remain the same for the current and next year's budget. After the cuts of the past few sessions, this is welcome news. But the more exciting development is that Governor Deal has recommended that all of the TANF funds for domestic violence be replaced with state funds. DHS Commissioner Clyde Reese testified to the joint Appropriations Committees that concerns have been raised as to the appropriateness of using TANF funds for domestic violence, so they have decided to replace these funds with state dollars. If the Legislature adopts the Governor's recommendations, domestic violence funding will be on very solid ground.
- Advocate & spousal privilege: Rep.
 Edward Lindsey introduced HB 711 which combines the prosecutor's bill to eliminate the spousal privilege in domestic violence cases with GCADV's bill to create advocate privilege. The bill has been assigned to the House Judiciary Committee and will be heard in subcommittee on Jan. 24. We are

- excited that our bill is moving forward quickly.
- Arrest for bond & bail condition
 violations: HB 342 was introduced last
 session by Rep. Doug McKillip to give law
 enforcement the authority to arrest
 defendants if they violate special conditions
 of bond or probation. This bill will be heard
 in a subcommittee of the House Judiciary
 Non Civil Committee on Jan. 24.
- Stop Violence Against Women Day is Feb. 2 from 8 am until 1 pm. Please plan to attend! We will gather at Central Presbyterian for breakfast and a legislative training and then head across the street to the Capitol to lobby our legislators. The day will conclude with a press conference in the Capitol Rotunda at noon.
