August Member Meeting


At our most recent Member Meeting we distributed accessibility kits to DV programs who operate shelters to help make their spaces more accessible to Deaf and hard of hearing survivors.

Promise Place operates in Fayette, Spalding, Pike, and Upson Counties. Promise place services over 3,000 survivors of domestic violence a year providing shelter, crisis intervention, legal advocacy, community education, safety planning, support groups. Their community outreach work includes law enforcement training and their Teen Dating Violence Prevention Program Free online one and a half hour webinar with resources click <u>here.</u>

The complex barriers to leaving an abusive relationship are significantly increased for victims of domestic violence who are people of color. According to the Violence Policy Center's 2018 report, Black women were killed by a male offender at a rate twice as high as White women. In addition to this alarming statistic, there still remains a lack of representation of People of Color in leadership positions throughout the domestic violence movement.

In order to best meet the needs of People of Color who are victims of domestic violence, those of us who strive to be White allies must be willing to look at the intersections of racism, oppression and victimization in our work.


In this webinar, we will:
